Approvals Update

Wind Prospect is pleased to share that we are continuing to make good progress on seeking local, state, and federal approvals for the Twin Hills Wind Farm project.

In July, we lodged a Development Application with the Shire of Three Springs, marking a significant regulatory milestone for the project.

Another key milestone was the referral of the project to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER). The Department will now assess the project against the WA Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act).

Earlier this year, the project was also referred to the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) for assessment against Commonwealth environment protection and biodiversity conservation legislation (the EPBC Act). DCCEEW has decided that the project is 'not a controlled action' under the relevant legislation. This means no further assessment of the project is required, so long as Wind Prospect carries out the project according to its submitted plans.

Further updates on project approvals will be provided as we progress through the local, state, and federal regulatory application process.
